

Program Information

Early Arrivals:

No students should arrive before 7:30 am. Students attending less than three periods are expected to arrive no more than 5 minutes before class unless they plan to study in the library.

Driving:

Students expecting to drive to school must register their vehicles when they register for classes. Approved students must park in assigned area. Vehicle use is a privilege and will be revoked if abused.

Textbooks:

All texts will be loaned to the student by the Malone Central School District. Students are expected to care for them and will be charged for loss or any unreasonable wear. If review books, manuals, magazines, etc., are used in a class, students will be expected to purchase their own.

Examinations:

All students must take examinations when scheduled. There will be no make-up exams!

Meals:

Free Breakfast served at 7:30 am
Free Lunch served daily (11:19-11:38 am)

Library:

The library will be open to students from 7:45 am until 1:29 pm daily.

Fire Drills:

Fire drills must be conducted by State Law. When the fire bell rings, go quickly and quietly to the nearest exit (or as directed by the instructor).

Study Hall:

Students with a free period will be assigned to a study hall.

Food/ Drinks:

Food/Drinks must be consumed in the cafeteria. They are not allowed in the classroom or gym areas. No resealable drinks are allowed.

Parking Area:

Students are not allowed in the parking lot area during or between classes. Students are not allowed to leave the building until classes are finished.

Visitors:

Student visitors are not allowed during school hours. Visitors must report and sign in at the summer school office.

Absence/Tardiness:

- More than 3 absences may result in the denial of academic credit.
- Less than 15 minutes tardy will count as 1/2 of an absence.
- More than 15 minutes tardy will count as a full absence.

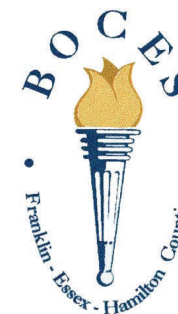

2009 Summer School Program

The Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES will operate a Regional Secondary Summer School from July 7th - August 11, 2009. The classes will be based at Franklin Academy High School. Course room assignments will be posted outside the summer school office.

REGISTRATION

Resident Students:

No student can individually contract with the BOCES Regional Summer Program. To enroll, a student must register through his/her principal. It is recommended that a student have a 55 average or above during the regular school year in the courses to be taken, to attend the Regional Secondary Summer School program for credit. The minimum average does not apply for courses without a prerequisite.

The deadline for registration is June 29, 2009 for grades 6-12. Students from non-participating districts may enroll in a BOCES operated summer school through a participating district. The participating district should then contact the BOCES Principal.

Non-Resident Students:

Payment is required at the time of registration, checks should be made payable to Salmon River Central School District Treasurer. To take an exam, a student must register through his/her principal.

Report Cards:

Report cards will be issued twice during the session. The first marking period ends July 24th. Report cards will be mailed out approximately July 28th. The second report will be after the examinations. To secure Regents credit, the pupil must pass the Regents Examination(s). Local exams will be given on August 12th, 13th and 14th. The final report card will be mailed home by August 21st. Class participation will generate a percentage of each marking period grade. Check with your counselor to see how the summer school grade will be combined or averaged.

Rules of Conduct

Before a student's registration is complete, both the student and his/her parent/guardian must acknowledge having read and will agree to comply with the rules as outlined in the Code of Conduct. This includes:

- Zero tolerance for weapons, illegal drugs, or controlled substances in or on school grounds. All such matters will be reported directly to the police and the Superintendent of Schools.
- Smoking or use of tobacco products are not allowed on school property.
- Insubordination to a teacher or any adult in authority may result in immediate suspension.
- Vandalism of school property may result in restitution, suspension and/or legal action.

- Students are prohibited from wearing apparel which is distracting and interferes with the health, safety or learning process of others
- Fighting, threatening or intimidating others is prohibited. Immediate suspension and/or police intervention may result.
- Any student causing a disruption to the learning process may be sent to the principal for disciplinary action. Any discipline matter requiring intervention beyond the Summer School Principal will be referred to the Home School District Administrator.
- Radios and walkmans are not allowed during summer school instruction. No electronic devices are allowed; such as but not limited to MP3 players, cell phones, etc.
- Use of skateboards, in-line skates, etc. during summer school on school property is prohibited.
